
"During your visit, you may wish to stop for a moment in Town Square. There, at the base of the flagpole, you will find a message which expresses Disneyland's true purpose.



MAIN STREET, U. S. A.



"All aboard" for a trip around Disneyland and into the Grand Canyon as the Santa Fe & Disneyland trains steam into the Main Street Station.

"Many of us fondly remember our 'small home town' and its friendly way of life at the turn of the century. To me, this era represents an important part of our heritage and thus we have endeavored to recapture those years on Main Street, U.S.A. at Disneyland.

"Here is the America of 1890-1910, at the crossroads of an era, where the gas lamp is gradually being replaced by the electric lamp; the plodding, horse-drawn street car is giving way to the chugging 'horseless carriage.' America was in transition: the discoveries of the late 19th Century were beginning to affect our way of life.

"Main Street represents the typical small town in the early 1900's—the heartline of America.

"For those of us who remember those carefree times, Main Street will bring back happy memories. For our younger visitors, it is an adventure in turning back the clock to the days of grandfather's youth.

"When you visit the apothecary, the ice cream parlor, the market house and the exhibits which have been re-created from this bygone era, we hope you'll visualize, as I often do, your own home town's main street, or the one your parents and grandparents have told you about.

"And before leaving Main Street, many of you will want to board one of the Santa Fe and Disneyland railroad trains at the old-fashioned Main Street depot for a complete trip around Disneyland, including our new Grand Canyon diorama where you'll see the breath-taking beauty of this natural wonder and its wild life inhabitants."

" There are many other happy adventures in Fantasyland, too. Through the Rabbit Hole, you'll find the nonsensical world of Alice in Wonderland; and Dumbo, the elephant with aerodynamic ears, will carry you on a flight high above Fantasyland. In colorful Dutch canal boats, you'll journey through Storybook Land to view the homes of the Three Little Pigs, Pinocchio's Village and Cinderella's dream castle.





"All of us, whether 10th generation or naturalized Americans, have cause to be proud of our country's history, shaped by the pioneering spirit of our forefathers.

" It is to those hardy pioneers, men and women of vision, faith and courage, that we have dedicated Frontierland. Here you can return to Frontier America, from the Revolutionary War era to the final taming of the Great Southwest.

" In Frontierland, you can journey down the Rivers of America aboard a Mississippi sternwheel steamboat for a glimpse of Mark Twain's America; laugh at the boisterous, rollicking floor show in the Golden Horseshoe 'Saloon'; view the ghost town of Rainbow Ridge, typical of the mining towns in the old West; and float to Tom Sawyer Island aboard a Huck Finn raft to explore Injun Joe's Cave and old Fort Wilderness.



" You can 'book passage' for a voyage aboard the three masted sailing ship, the 'Columbia', one of Frontierland's newest attractions.


" Disneyland's 'Columbia' is a replica of the original ship that made maritime history as the first American vessel to sail 'round the world.

" All these and many other adventures in Frontierland are designed to give you the feeling of having 'lived', even for a short while, during our country's days of pioneer development."













"Time moves forward to the year 1987. You board a rocket ship and 'blast off' into outer space, leaving the earth far below in your journey through space towards your destination—the Moon. Nearby, on the Space Satellite, you'll see America from a space platform as it orbits around our globe.

"Whether you're a grown-up or a youngster, you'll want to visit Monsanto's House of the Future. Inside this unique home, plastics play an important part in developments for future living. 





"Everyone has a dream of traveling to mysterious far-off places, or exotic tropical regions of the world.


"To create a land which would make these dreams a reality, we pictured ourselves far from civilization, in the remote jungles of Asia and Africa. The result is Adventureland.










bia," the Alice in Wonderland Adventures, and the Excursion Train.





Fabulous Disneyland Hotel and Gourmet Restaurants



Located right across the street from Disneyland Park, the new Disneyland Hotel is a year 'round resort designed and priced for family fun.

Featuring the most modern accommodations uniquely set in the midst of an orange grove—with orange trees at the back door of every room—the Disneyland Hotel is designed for restful relaxation and is operated by Wrather Hotels, Inc.

There's something for everyone in the family at the Hotel. Its complete facilities include 200 rooms, each with sun deck or patio and a TV set, distinctive stores in the shopping arcade, an Olympic-size swimming pool, wading pools and sand play areas for children, a golf putting green and shuffleboard courts.

The Gourmet Restaurants, composed of coffee shop, cocktail lounge, dining rooms and banquet hall, overlook the Hotel's lighted and terraced pools and orange

groves. Breakfast, luncheon, dinner and late snacks are featured at the Gourmet. Private parties and banquets of from 25 to 500 people are accommodated on the second floor of the air conditioned restaurant. Entertainment is featured nightly in the lounge, and fashion shows are presented in the restaurant.

Each of the Disneyland Hotel's rooms is designed to sleep four people in comfort and convenience in a single unit, with special facilities for youngsters and air conditioned comfort as well. Courtesy guest parking is practically at every door.

In the main administrative building, guests will find a wide variety of distinctive shops offering gifts, clothing, cosmetics and sundries, cameras, film, handbags and jewelry, Hawaiian and Latin imports, toys, flowers and candy. A barber shop and beauty salon are located within the Hotel, as well as airline ticket agencies.




Conventions are a family affair in this unique setting, with Disneyland Park just minutes away by special courtesy tram service. Four complete conference rooms are available for business meetings and conventions.

The Coral Swim Club is ideally situated midway between the hotel units and the main administration building and restaurants. The Club's large Olympic-size heated pool, surrounded by cabanas, deck chairs and lounging areas, is ideal for sun bathing and relaxation. Alongside the main pool is a smaller wading pool and sand-and-play areas for youngsters, and nearby, the championship putting green and shuffleboard facilities.

Limousine service is available from Los Angeles International Airport directly to the Hotel, and the courtesy tram meets all incoming helicopter flights at Disneyland's own Heliport.
